

## TCU Alumni Book Club

### FAQ:

**How do I join the book club?** To get started visit [alumni.tcu.edu](http://alumni.tcu.edu) for the Book Club page and link. You will receive a confirmation email with the link to join Good Reads. Once you have set up your free account at Good Reads, you can start reading along with us!

### What is Good Reads?

TCU is using [www.goodreads.com](http://www.goodreads.com) as the website for our book club. This allows you to follow along when we post questions for discussion with our moderator, and when available, the author. You can also create your own “bookshelf” to organize what you’ve read or want to read.

### If I don’t live local to the TCU campus, can I still be in the book club?

Yes! Your membership is virtual so you can live anywhere in the world and still be a member of the TCU Alumni Book Club.

### Is there a cost? Do I have to purchase the book?

Membership in the Alumni Book Club is free. It’s up to each reader to determine how they want to read along with us – book, audio, a reading app, or through your local public library.

The TCU Library will have a few copies of books available to check out, and the TCU Campus Store will have copies available for purchase with a 10% discount to TCU alumni.

### How will I know when a new book is being offered?

You will receive an email from the TCU Alumni Association and the book will be featured on Good Reads.

### How many books will be offered?

We will promote four books per year – one in the fall, one in the spring, and two books during the summer.

### What if I don’t read or finish the books, will my membership be terminated?

We understand life gets in the way of reading, but we still want you be a member of our reading community. You will remain a member of the TCU Alumni Book Club until you opt out.

### How are the books selected?

We are partnering with the TCU Campus Store, the TCU Library and the TCU Press, as well as TCU’s Schools and Colleges for suggestions. We will also select books based on popular review sites like Good Reads, the NYTimes, the New Yorker, Kirkus Reviews, and Amazon. Periodically, we will invite our book club members to vote on a selection.
